Why Now Matters:

- **Decision Point:** If we reach at least \$8 million by December 31, 2025, we can move forward with prequalifying contractors. This milestone will keep us on track to begin construction in summer 2026.
- Momentum is Building: From gifts of \$50 to \$500,000, every contribution has made a difference. The majority of support so far has come from individualsneighbours, families, and community members-who believe in this vision.
- Recognition Opportunities: To honour generosity, naming rights are available for rooms and spaces within the residence, including the front entrance.



We will maintain collaboration with local governments to establish a hospice that embodies the shared values, needs, and strengths of our region. This initiative will serve as a lasting testament to our collective achievements.

Closer To Home: A Vision Becoming A Reality



On September 18, 2025, Saugeen Hospice welcomed community members to our third annual **Community Update and Annual General Meeting** at the Best Western Hotel in Walkerton.

The theme of this year's gathering was: "Closer to Home: A Vision Becoming a Reality."

The evening included important updates on various aspects of Saugeen Hospice's construction fundraising campaign and the design and build progress of over the past year. But beyond the numbers and blueprints, participants were reminded of the true heart of this project, the people it will serve.

Together, we listened to a moving recording that shared a fictional story of a future family's journey at Saugeen Hospice. It was a powerful reminder that this project is not simply about constructing a building, it is about creating a home where compassion, dignity, and peace will surround families when they need it the most.

Architect, Grant Diemert, reviewed the status of the build approval process with the Ministry of Health and provided an update on the planned construction start date of Saugeen Hospice the summer of 2026.

Volunteers were also celebrated as the true cornerstone of Saugeen Hospice. Their hands, hearts, and dedication are what make this dream possible. From fundraising and community outreach, to the countless unsee acts of service, volunteers are the lifeblood of this project. Without them, this home of compassion could never be built or sustained.

Following the presentations, participants explored interactive stations with opportunities to ask questions and learn more about the building design, the model of care and volunteer opportunities, and our construction fundraising campaign and fundraising opportunities and progress.

His work reminds us all that behind every hospice is a community, and Ken has helped lead ours with grace.

The Heart of Hospice: Volunteers Make it Home

At Saugeen Hospice's Community Update, the theme "Closer to Home: A Vision Becoming a Reality" resonated deeply with attendees, reminding everyone that building a hospice is about more than bricks and mortar, it's about creating a community rooted in compassion.

A member of the Saugeen Hospice volunteer Board of Directors provided thoughtful observations, drawing on professional expertise, to highlight how small gestures can have a significant impact. The presenter recognized volunteers for their central role in hospice care, acknowledging contributions ranging from welcoming guests at reception to providing companionship at the bedside, all of which support comfort, dignity, and connection during critical periods.

The presenter recounted her experiences demonstrating the significant role volunteers play in enhancing hospice life: preparing nutritious meals, providing music that creates a calming atmosphere, maintaining gardens that promote tranquility, and establishing meaningful traditions, particularly during holiday periods. These accounts highlighted how the voluntary contribution of time can positively impact individuals coping with illness, bereavement, and loss.

A key message was evident: volunteers play integral roles as companions, contributors to meaningful experiences, and the foundation of hospice care. With the upcoming opening of Saugeen Hospice Residence, individuals are invited to join and participate in this community.
